Thank you for letter of June 19, 2009. We feel we need to clarify some of the items in your letter so we can be clear on guidelines under which we are working.

Phase I-Consultation Outreach is a most important issue and needs to be dealt with first; this is why the process worked in the Nawiliwili case. In our June 16th meeting we asked you to include the Goras in consultation. Additionally we received a request from Manny Kuloloioto be considered a cultural descendant. His claim will be evaluated for the 69 inadvertent burials, and we request that he be added to your list of people to consult with. Your outreach efforts need to be as broad as possible and cannot be limited to your congregation or to just the families that are known to have burials in the area.. You may find additional cultural descendants once your ad has been published and these folks need to be included as well. SHPD requests that you provide us with a complete list of everyone consulted as part of your weekly reports.

Phase II – Low Impact Point six, CSH shall mark **all** of their GPR anomalies. We request a copy of the GRP map we saw when we met in May. After outreach the next most important issue is how the burials are handled by the archaeologist. If there is a possibility of finding something there, the archaeologist needs to work carefully around this area. This is why **all** the GPR anomalies will need to be flagged. We will verify this has happened before you move to Phase III.

Point seven, CSH needs to provide detailed information on the soil testing. When and how often will soil be screened? How much will be screened? What methodology (size of screens, we assumed screening is by hand not a machine) will be used for screening. The methodology section needs to be more detailed.

We agree with the rest of your comments and appreciate the Church's open communication with the Department of Health and our Historic Preservation Division staff.
