KING WILLIAM CHARLES LUNALILO



(1835—1874)

Reigned from 1873 to 1874. He was known as the people's king, and walked from Iolani Palace to Kawaiaha`o to be crowned King of Hawaii. In 1874 King Lunalilo was buried on the grounds of the church, the only Hawaiian sovereign besides Kamehameha I not buried in the Royal Mausoleum in Nuuanu Valley. He gave his estates for the care of the makuas of Hawaii.
