Queen Elizabeth Ka'ahumanu



(1772-1832)

Favorite wife of Kamehameha the Great, appointed to be the Kuhina Nui (Prime Minister) to King Kamehameha II. She was the highest officer of the kingdom next to the King. By her strong will and native brilliance, she saw what was best for her people and the Kingdom. Convinced that the ancient gods had departed, she, with Liholiho and the high priest Hewahewa, led in pronouncing the end of the Kapu (Religious) System. She saw the contrast of life-styles between the missionary and the non-missionary and asked those who were teaching her people to read and write, to sew and plant and live righteous lives, if they would stay. Queen Ka'ahumanu accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior. When she died on June 5, 1832, it was said that "there is no one her equal to fill her place." Her last words were . . .

*"Eia no wau e Iēsu...E nana 'olu'olu mai..."
"Here I am Lord Jesus, Grant me thy gracious smile..."*

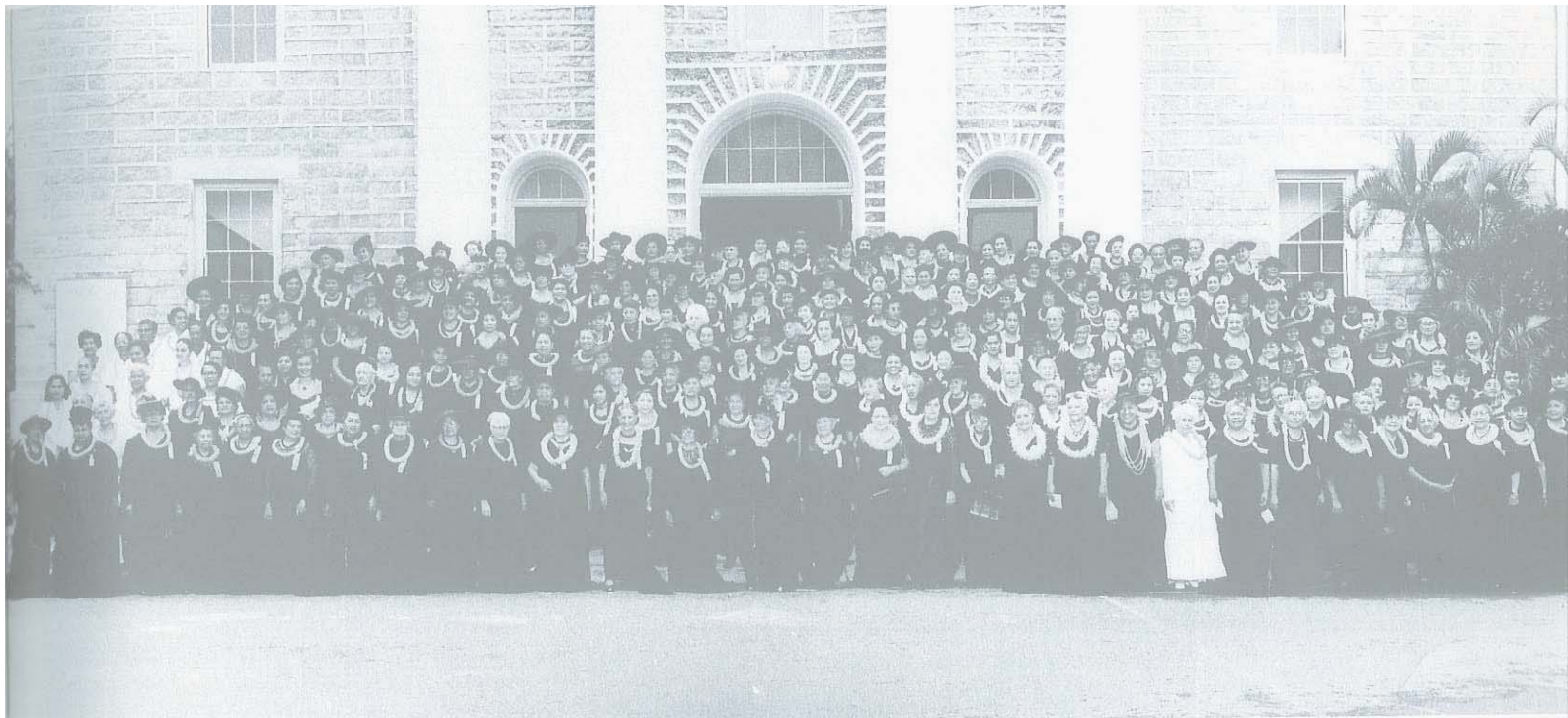

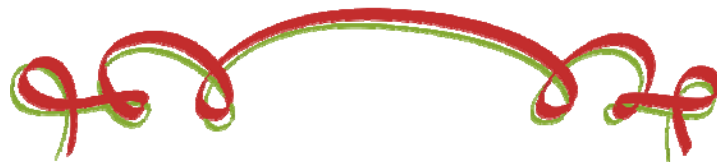

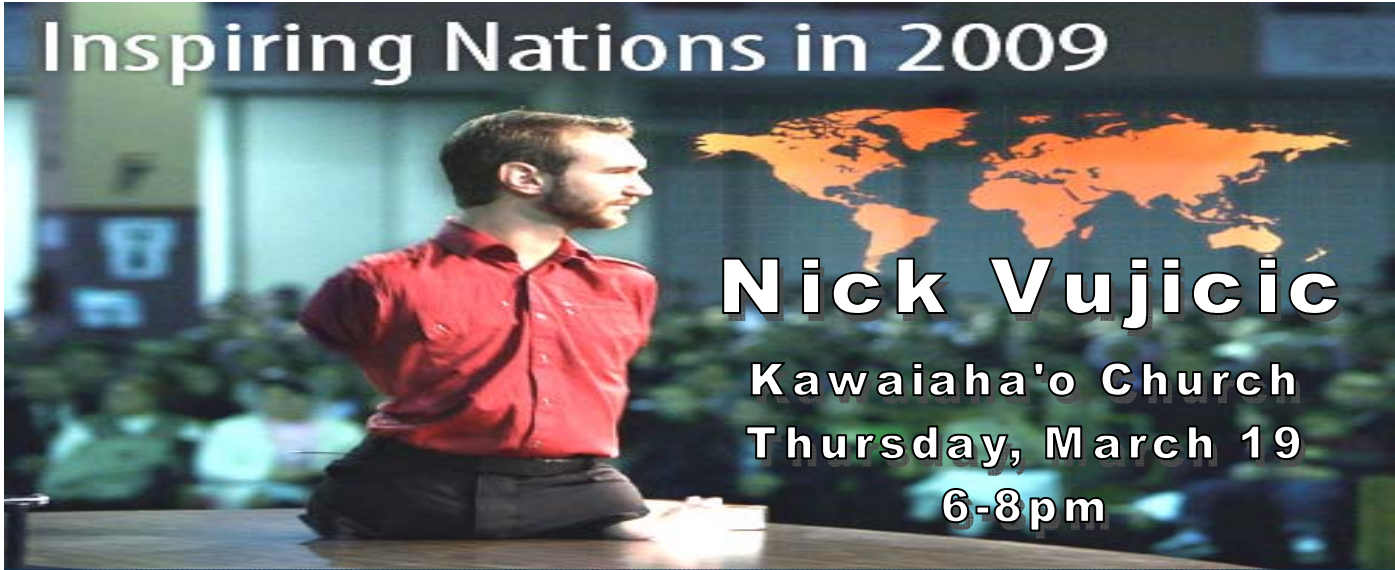
