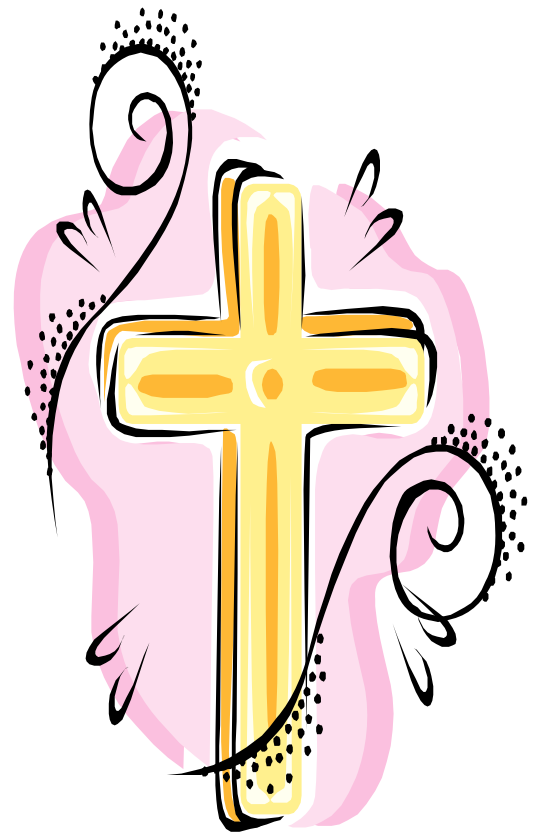

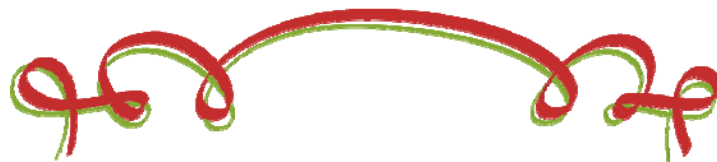

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

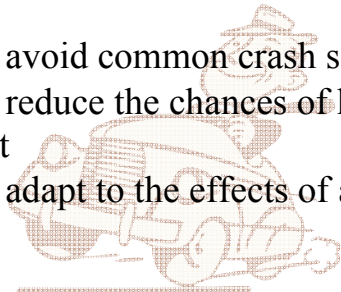
