(1838 - 1917)

Last reigning Monarch of Hawai'i and sister of King David Kalākaua, she reigned from 1891 to 1893. She led the choir at Kawaiaha'o Church until she became Queen and composed many beautiful Hawaiian songs, including the world-wide favorite "Aloha 'Oe." She left her estate to the care of orphan and destitute children in Hawai'i with preference to those of Hawaiian/part Hawaiian ancestry.

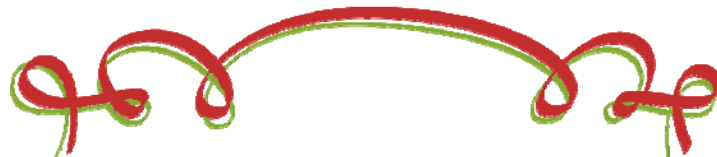

Please kōkua by donating necessary items to the kūpuna at Lunalilo Home. Items can be dropped off in the Pastor's Office M-F from 8am-4:30pm.

Some items on the kūpuna's wish list include:

1. Food Items-large cans/boxes
 - a. Dry Foods: Rice, flour, sugar, dry cereal (whole grain-NO sugar coated); dry beans (black eyed peas, pinto beans, navy white beans); canned beans (pork and beans, kidney beans, garbanzo beans); canned tuna (in water), salmon, sardines, canned corn (whole kernel and cream corn)
 - b. Snacks: Soda crackers (no Saltines or salted crackers); graham crackers; vanilla wafers; animal cookies; Jell-o (diet preferable); popcorn (no salt); peanut butter; jelly or jams.
 - c. Paper Goods: Dinner napkins; paper plates- 6" and 9" sizes; plastic spoons, knives and forks; plastic cups- 5 oz. and 7 oz. sizes; straws
2. Craft supplies-scissors (straight and assorted cuts), construction paper (assorted colors), glue (big bottles), glitter (assorted colors), pens/markers, Sharpies, Scotch tape, double sided tape, pipe cleaners, colored tissue paper, watercolor paints, yarn, lei making needles, photo albums, baskets, balloons, ribbon, card stock (assorted colors)
