KING WILLIAM CHARLES LUNALILO



(1835—1874)

He reigned from 1873 to 1874. He was known as the people's king, and walked from 'Iolani Palace to Kawaiaha'o to be crowned King of Hawai'i. In 1874 King Lunalilo was buried on the grounds of the church, the only Hawaiian sovereign besides Kamehameha I not buried in the Royal Mausoleum in Nu'uano Valley. He gave his estates for the care of the kūpuna of Hawai'i.

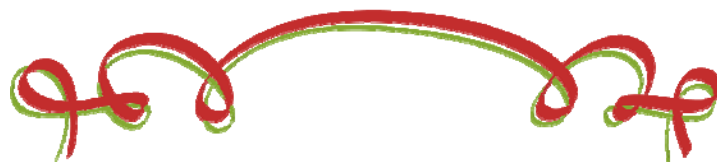
MPC Ground Breaking
