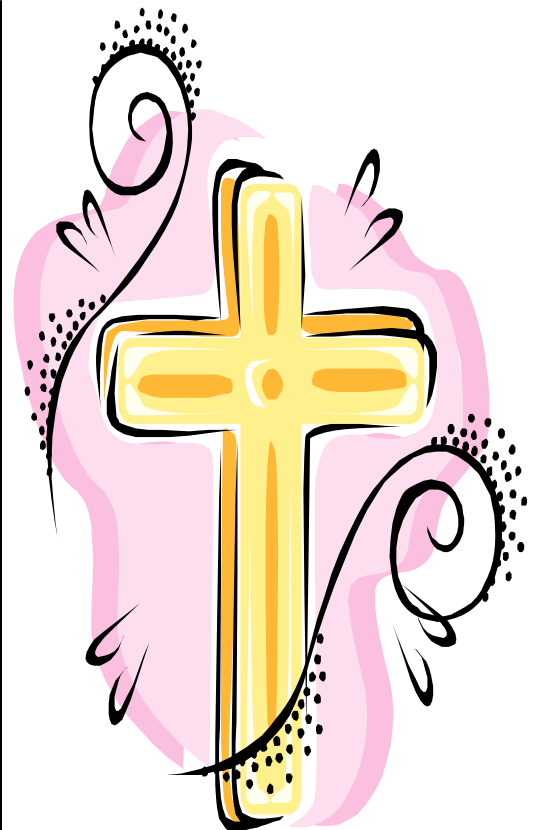

The Stone Church- a history of Kawaiaha'o Church from its establishment in 1820.

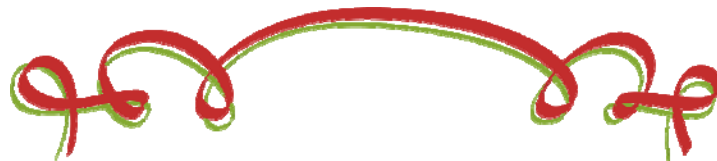
