**King Kamehameha V**



(1830—1872)

Lot Kapuāiwa Kalandimākuā Ali‘iōlani Kalani Kapuapaikalaninui ruled from 1863 to 1872. He was the son of High Chiefess Kīna‘u and Chief Mataio Kekūānao‘a and the grandson of Kamehameha I. His motto was “*Onipa ‘a*” and he worked diligently for his people & kingdom and was described as “*the last great chief of the olden type.*” He established the Constitution of 1864, which returned various powers to the king, and he opposed annexation to the United States.

He began the modernization of Honolulu with the construction of the Honolulu Post Office and Ali‘iōlani Hale. He moved the Kamehameha Day celebration from December to June and established the Royal Order of Kamehameha I in 1865 to honor his grandfather. He organized the Royal Hawaiian Band, which became a special gift of music to the people. He worried over the huge impact of foreign diseases on the Hawaiian people, which resulted in a 60% decrease in the population of Hawaiians during his lifetime, and established the colony on Kalaupapa, Moloka‘i to prevent the spread of leprosy.

He was a pupil of our missionary teachers, Amos and Juliette Cooke. He later reigned from 1863 to 1872. He was a strong King of a strong government, who changed the constitution of Hawai‘i its first unicameral legislature. During his reign, many ancient hula and kahuna rituals were revived.

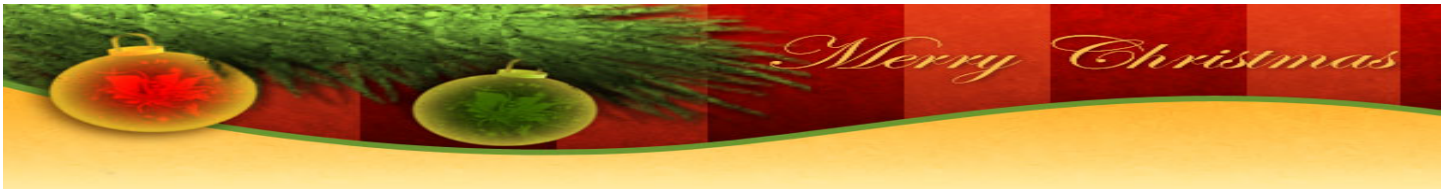
