Loveliest of Princesses, declared heir apparent to the throne of Hawaii on March 9, 1891. The daughter of Archibald Scott Cleghorn and Miriam Likelike born on October 16, 1875. Princess Ka`iulani was deeply educated, especially in the ways of the English and became very skilled in the area of diplomacy. Princess Ka`iulani also had time for fun, She threw luaus for her friends and she loved to ride her horse, Fairy to Diamond Head and Waikiki Beach and she loved to talk to the Hawaiian people. Princess Ka`iulani attended a private school in England. Before she left for England, she made a very famous friend, Robert Louis Stevenson, the author of such books as Treasure Island.
